- Ms. Miele reported that the Senior Citizen Center is not interested in the CDs that the Library is discarding.
- A motion to approve the policies on "Internet & Computer Use" and "Outreach" was made by Ms. Lowenstein and seconded by Ms. Nagy. It passed unanimously with these changes:
  - Delete the sentence about groups that are ineligible for outreach service.
  - o Delete item A.4.a, which refers to ineligible organizations.
  - Delete the sentence about more information (bottom of A.4).
  - In the Internet/Computer policy, Section C.2.b., revise to indicate that headphones or closed captioning are required (not just recommended).
  - There was some discussion about services to home daycare centers. Ms. Miele said she would get more information about the number of providers.\*
